Students will demonstrate a strong and continually increasing rate of mastery over the Georgia Performance Standards.

Students will demonstrate strong and continually improving communication skills (English/Language Arts and comprehensive skills (Math) when compared to other students in the nation.

Students will demonstrate strong and continually growing breadth of knowledge of the world (Social Studies) as well as strong skills at gathering information about the world as compared to others across the nation.

2021-2022 Academic Year Goals

70% passing rate on the 2021-22 Reading and Math Milestone tests.

70% of students will be able to articulate their understanding of learned concepts in clear and concise ways (accountable talk), making evident their ability to think deeply and to problem solve.
